Homework Policy

- There will be problems assigned after completion of each section. Those problems will be due the following day unless otherwise stated. Assignments will be due at the beginning of the class period they are due.
- Every assignment is worth 10-15 points.
- Late Policy/No Name Policy
 - For each day after an assignment is late, it will lose 10% of the total score (for example: if an assignment is 3 days late and the student scores a 9/10 the final grade of the assignment will be a 6/10)
 - After 5 days, any missing assignment becomes a 0% in the gradebook
 - If an assignment is turned in with no name, it will be placed in the "Nameless" box. It is the responsibility of the student to check the "Nameless" box if an assignment is marked missing. If it is in the box, there will be a 10% deduction on the score.
- REDOs
 - REDOs on assignments are available for any failing score (less than a 70%).
 - The grade can be brought up to a 70%
 - A REDO will be put in Infinite Campus for any assignment less than a 50%
 - A student will have 5 days for any REDO

Quizzes/Assessments

- Quizzes for my class are a formal way of checking students understanding during a chapter but giving them the assistance of notes.
- Assessments are anything I use throughout or at the end of a chapter to assess a student's understanding without notes. This may be a short "pop" quiz at the beginning or end of a class or a formal test at the end of a chapter. Formal tests will be worth more points than any informal assessment.
- REDOs are not available for any test. They are available at my discretion for a student who significantly scores low on a quiz.

Grading

- Daily Assignments are worth 20% of total grade
- Quizzes are worth 30% of total grade
- Assessments are worth 50% of total grade
- (A: 100-94%) (B: 93-87%) (C: 86-79%) (D: 78-70%) (F: 69% or below)

Extra Help
